



Silver Acorn award for Jack Evans

MR. JACK EVANS, Assistant District Commissioner of the St. Marylebone District Scouts, above, receives his Silver Acorn award in recognition of long service from County Commissioner Mr. George Speakman at Haberdasher's Hall, Staining Lane, in the City, on Tuesday evening.

Mr. Evans, of Garland House, Carlton Hill, St. John's Wood, has been occupied with local Scouting for most of his life.

In 1921 he transferred from the old 5th St. Marylebone to the 8th. He received his first

warrant in 1930 and became a Scoutmaster in 1934. In 1950 he was presented with the Scout Medal of Merit for outstanding service and has been Assistant District Commissioner for the last 14 years.
